### **Project Description**

My team's project is focused on creating a tool or resource that will help gardeners with their everyday gardening tasks. We have yet to decide if we will focus on professional or recreational gardeners.

## **Summary of Products**

While searching for gardening resources and tools I noticed ads for pest repellent type products aimed at gardeners. After seeing a few pest repellent products I decided to check on Google Shopping and Amazon and found hundreds of results for 'Ultrasonic' pest repellents. Apparently these devices emit a high pitch frequency when they detect motion, and this frequency is supposed to make the area unpleasant to certain creatures. This type of technology seems to be a form of 'Unpleasant Design', but for animals that might eat up one's garden.

A few things I noticed looking through these products is that many of them claim to repel specific types of animals. There were few of them that claimed to repel ALL pests. Also, I noticed that customer reviews for many of these products (the products below included) did not seem to have fabulous customer reviews. Both products I found to focus on have 3 star reviews. After researching these ultrasonic pest repellents and reading some reviews I am questioning the effectiveness and longevity of these devices. Many reviewers said that they do not even last a 'full growing season' (Amazon Comments) or only partially eliminate their pest problem. The goal of the users that buy these products is to find a humane and non-chemical way of ridding their garden of pests that make it difficult for them to grow anything. A competing product on the market are many forms of chemical repellants. These repellants appear to be both cheaper and more effective than the ultrasonic repellents due to the difference in customer reviews. The bottle of repellent from Target below is affordable at only \$6.99, but has almost a 4 star rating as well. It seems that as far as getting rid of pests, those wishing to be more humane and ecologically-friendly may find that they cannot get rid of pests as well as those who choose to use chemicals. Choosing between these products can be both a moral and monetary problem for gardeners.


